DAY 1: JUNE 1st

Welcome to Corner Brook, Newfoundland

Your journey begins today! Fly to Newfoundland.

DAY 2: JUNE 2nd

Corner Brook

The morning & afternoon are at leisure to explore the town.



Tonight, enjoy a welcome reception with your travel companions at a local establishment. (B)

DAY 3: JUNE 3rd

Corner Brook

This morning, meet your Globus Tour Director and traveling companions for a welcome breakfast, followed by an orientation tour of Corner Brook. Scenic drive along Humber Arm and the Bay of Islands en route to Frenchman's Cove and Lark Harbour. Enjoy a stop at Lark Harbour. Soak in great views of Guernsey, Tweed, and the Pearl Islands on the return to Corner Brook. (B)

DAY 4: JUNE 4th

Corner Brook – Gros Morne National Park – Port au Choix – St. Barbe

Skirt the shores of Deer Lake and head north to Gros Morne National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its exceptional beauty and unique geological features. At the Lobster Cove Head, visit the lighthouse and the fascinating marine

displays. Next is Broom Point, highlighting the history of Canada's earliest fishing settlements. View glacier-carved gorges on the way to Port au Choix National Historic Site. The exhibits focus on archaeological finds of Maritime Archaic and Dorset peoples who settled here before 2000 BC (B, L, D)

DAY 5: JUNE 5th

St. Barbe – Blanc Sablon – Red Bay – L'Anse-au-Clair

Board your ferry to cross the Strait of Belle Isle, **known as Iceberg Alley**, to Blanc Sablon. Then, to Red Bay, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the first major industrial complex of the New World and home to a 16th-century Basque whaling station exhibit. Continue to L'Anse-au-Clair. **Note:** *Whale sightings are not guaranteed* (B, D)

DAY 6: JUNE 6th

L'Anse-au-Clair – L'Anse aux Meadows – St. Anthony

Norsemen Sites & Nature Sights This morning, take the ferry back to St. Barbe. Visit L'Anse aux Meadows National Historic Site for a look at Viking settlers here. Return to St. Anthony where your afternoon is free. Perhaps a walk along the Bottom Brook Trail, a waterfowl sanctuary where a variety of birds may be spotted. This evening, enjoy dinner with lively entertainment. (B, L, D)

DAY 7: JUNE 7th

St. Anthony – Gros Morne Area

Travel along the Viking Trail, with a stop at Arches Provincial Park to photograph the two large arches carved by the pounding sea. Then, board a boat for a scenic cruise on Bonne Bay that reveals a pristine world of two fjords and the deep waters of the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Enjoy live commentary throughout your cruise to learn about Gros Morne Mountain, the geology of the Tablelands, the whales that frequent the deep waters of this fjord. Tonight, enjoy a seasonal seafood dinner. (B, D)

DAY 8: JUNE 8th

Gros Morne Area – Gander

After breakfast, depart for Gander, once the international aviation crossroads of the world for a visit to the North Atlantic Aviation Museum to learn the history of North Atlantic aviation from the 1930s to its unexpected role in the days following the 9/11 tragedy. Join the Beyond Words Tour to learn of the role that Gander played days after the tragic event. (B)

DAY 9: JUNE 9th

Gander – Twillingate – Terra Nova National Park – Clarenville

Drive along the Road to the Isles, the local predilection for colorful language comes across with place names, such as "Too Good Arm," "Virgin Arm," and "Crow Head." On the way to Twillingate, visit the Prime Berth Fishing Museum and see the Long Point Lighthouse. With luck, you might spot whales along the coast en route to Terra Nova National Park. Continue to Clarenville, situated in beautiful Trinity Bay. (B, D)

DAY 10: JUNE 10th

Clarenville – Cape Bonavista – Trinity – St. John's

Travel to Cape Bonavista to admire the beautiful cliffs and coastlines. In Bonavista, learn how modern North America began when John Cabot made landfall here in 1497. A visit to Ryan Premises National Historic Site commemorates the prosperous fishing industry from the early 1500s to today. Later, continue to historic Trinity, one of the oldest communities in North America, with its scenic harbor.

Enjoy a regional lunch at a local restaurant followed by a walking tour with a Local Guide to hear stories that bring this picturesque village alive. (B, L)

DAY 11: JUNE 11th

St. John's – Excursion to Witless Bay & Cape Spear National Historic Site

Today, travel to Witless Bay, where whales and puffins abound. Board your boat for a narrated cruise around the three islands in the renowned Witless Bay Ecological Reserve. Then, visit Cape Spear National Historic Site, the most easterly point in North America. (B)

DAY 12: JUNE 12th


St. John's

Tour the oldest settlement in North America with a Local Guide. Visit Signal Hill National Historic Site, Cabot Tower, the Old Town, and the Basilica of St. John the Baptist. This afternoon is free to explore on your own. You may wish to visit The Rooms, where you can immerse yourself in the local culture through history, heritage, and artistic expression or spend time browsing the many boutiques and galleries of St. John's. The afternoon is free to explore on your own.

This evening, your Tour Director hosts a special farewell dinner that includes a traditional Screech-In ceremony, wonderful conversation and cuisine make the perfect finale for your tour. (B, D)

DAY 13: JUNE 13th

St. John's

 **Newfoundland Food Tour** – There's no better way to learn about the history and culture of a community than to eat its food. On this Newfoundland Food Tour, you will eat your way through downtown St. John's. Newfoundland and Labrador has one of the most unique food cultures in Canada. Long known for seafood, wild game, and delicious traditional meals, the province has a long list of mouth-watering ingredients and recipes. From a CFA finding success selling beloved Newfoundland pastry to a haunted pub that inspired a TV set to a former fruit stand literally built on the ashes of the Great Fire, we'll explore the people, stories, and food that make the city unique.
